


# Cure Speed vs. Substrate

The rate of cure will depend on the substrate used. The graph below shows the breakloose strength developed with time on  $3/8 \times 16$  steel nuts & bolts compared to different materials and tested according to ISO 10964. All samples pre-torqued to 5 N·m.



#### Cure Speed vs. Temperature


The rate of cure will depend on the temperature. The graph below shows the breakloose strength developed with time at different temperatures on 3/8 x 16 steel nuts & bolts and tested according to ISO 10964. All samples pre-torqued to 5 N·m.



#### Cure Speed vs. Activator

Where cure speed is unacceptably long, or large gaps are present, applying activator to the surface will improve cure speed. The graph below shows the breakloose strength developed with time using Activator  $7471^{\text{TM}}$  and  $7649^{\text{TM}}$  on 3/8 x 16 zinc dichromate steel nuts and bolts and tested according to ISO 10964. All samples pre-torqued to 5 N·m.





#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

This product is not recommended for use in pure oxygen and/or oxygen rich systems and should not be selected as a sealant for chlorine or other strong oxidizing materials.

For safe handling information on this product, consult the Safety Data Sheet (SDS).

Where aqueous washing systems are used to clean the surfaces before bonding, it is important to check for compatibility of the washing solution with the adhesive. In some cases these aqueous washes can affect the cure and performance of the adhesive.

This product is not normally recommended for use on plastics (particularly thermoplastic materials where stress cracking of the plastic could result). Users are recommended to confirm compatibility of the product with such substrates.

#### Directions for use:

# For Assembly

- For best results, clean all surfaces (external and internal) with a LOCTITE<sup>®</sup> cleaning solvent and allow to dry.
- If the cure speed is too slow, spray all threads with Activator 7471™ or 7649™ and allow to dry.
- 3. Shake the product thoroughly before use.
- 4. To prevent the product from clogging in the nozzle, do not allow the tip to touch metal surfaces during application.
- 5. For Thru Holes, apply several drops of the product onto the bolt at the nut engagement area.
- 6. For Blind Holes, apply several drops of the product down the internal threads to the bottom of the hole.

- 7. For Sealing Applications, apply a 360° bead of product to the leading threads of the male fitting, leaving the first thread free. Force the material into the threads to thouroughly fill the voids. For bigger threads and voids, adjust product amount accordingly and apply a 360° bead of product on the female threads also.
- 8. Assemble and tighten as required.

# For Disassembly

- 1. Remove with standard hand tools.
- Where hand tools do not work because of excessive engagement length or large diameters (over 1"), apply localized heat to approximately 250 °C. Disassemble while hot.

#### For Cleanup

 Cured product can be removed with a combination of soaking in a Loctite solvent and mechanical abrasion such as a wire brush.
